The office, with seven current employees, is partnered with several Pennsylvania firms and academic institutions from its new offices at 1 Pasquerilla Plaza, in Johnstown.

Murtha Institute for Homeland Security on the Civil Support Team Information Management System (CIMS) Project; and Washington and Jefferson College, supporting the National Guard Bureau in the development of distance learning courses for the IT Leadership Program. Booz Allen was also previously associated with the St. Francis University Small Business Development Center and the Center of Excellence for Remotely Underserved Areas (CERMUSA) on a Navy Telemedicine project.

"Congressman John Murtha has played a pivotal role bringing government work and leading technologies here, all of which is helping take critical pieces of the nation's public service to new heights," said Booz Allen Vice President Joe Logue. "We feel that our growing foothold in the region will lend greater support to solving challenges with the work being done here, and also benefit the local economy."
