

January 6, 2009 - Murtha: U.S. Navy Awards CTC \$10 million Contract

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Congressman John P. Murtha, Chairman of the House Appropriations Subcommittee on Defense, announced today that Concurrent Technologies Corporation (CTC) has been awarded a \$10,000,000 ceiling-priced contract for the development of the Navy's MH-60S Helicopter Aircrew Carriage Stream, Tow, and Recovery System Trainer (CSTRS-T).

The MH-60S Knighthawk, which entered the service in 2002, is a multi-mission naval helicopter. Under this Navy contract, CTC will design, produce, and test a system trainer to train operators of the aircraft.

"With all new aircraft, it is important that we prepare and support pilots to operate safely in various environments," commented Murtha. "CTC's engineering and production capabilities are internationally known, and this contract further exemplifies the U.S. government's confidence in both their services and employees."

Work, to include the initial construction and testing of the trainer, will be performed at CTC's Johnstown, PA facilities. The CSTRS-T is expected to be completed by December 2011, and will be installed at the Naval Station Norfolk, VA.

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
